In the last newsletter we were trying to find the number of the g-1/2 inch tall Creme DeCoffee jug. The number in the bottom is definitely a $\# 185$ thanks to Tom Cummings who has a peach color jug. Then the \#165 is a 11-1/2 inch Erecian jug and no two pieces have the same number.

After a long dry spell in our antique shoppings we visited a mall in Medford, $O R$ today. Uhl pieces thet we spotted but did not buy are a blue/white lined hotel cuspidor, a Boston Baked Beans pot, red-orange cookie jar and salt and pepper with painted flowers and two advertising miniatures. Unl is not easily found on the west coast. This is extremely unusual to see in one visit.

What we did buy is a blue \#34 Grecian miniature. Alsog we hit the prize in one booth with several pieces in rose. we purshased a set of four cups and saucers, four g inch luncheon plates, thres 5 inch porridge bowls and one 6 inch plate. In addition, a sugar and creamer sets a lipped ice water pitcher, and a b-8 batter bowl lined in white.

For fung I looked up the original prices of most of these items. Purchased new, the dinnerware cost $\$ 3.20$. The sugar and creamer. 70 and ice water pitcher $\$ 1.00$. The batter bowl was .70 and the \#34 jug about. 23 for a grand total of $\$ 5.83$. We paid a bit more than that, but no eomplaints from us!

A recent letter from Alan Biby has created a question that we need help in answering. Many miniatures found today have had flowers hand painted on them over the glaze. Alan has bought a square jug, a pair of ladies slippers, an military boot, and a dutch shoe. All are unmarked but definitely Uhl, could it have been a home craft project? Alan bought a dutch shoe that seems to have the answer. It had a round foil label on the bottom, "Genuine HAND FAINTED KAULWARE Chicago".

Well Alan you and I have part of the answer, the painting was done by someone in Chicago. I also have a blue military boot with this same foil label on the back side of the boot.

Does anyone know the whole story behind these hand painted Uhl pieaes. Flease drop me a line so I can pass along this information.

Alan has made some rather nice purchases recently, a 160 z mug "ALFINE HOUSE HWY b6 EVANSVILLE" for a small $\$ 11.00$ fee. A white slipper, white military boot, blue globe cookie jar (which needs a lid), and a yellow large dutch shoe.
