



LOOKING BACK

The following is the first newsletter published by Sue Uhl who is now Sue Maynard. We thought it would be nice to share these past newsletters with you since we are in our tenth year as a club. In each of the next five newsletters we will take you through the first year of the collectors society.

UHL COLLECTORS SOCIETY NEWSLETTER AUGUST 1985

MAY I INTRODUCE.....GREG AND BRENDA SHINE FROM CONRAD, IOWA...

We began collecting UHL pottery after tracing our family history back to Charles Uhl from Wittensburg, Germany, whose family settled in Ohio. We're not sure there's any connection, but that makes it interesting. Uhl pottery is very uncommon in Iowa, almost rare! But by letting friends know what we're collecting, we've found a number of pieces through them. Recently, we received a 5 gallon Uhl jug for babysitting.

My favorite pieces are serving dishes that we can use when entertaining, like mugs, bowls, pitchers. My husband's favorites are 3 miniature jugs with "Greetings form Uhl Pottery", "Merry Christmas 1937", and "Merry Christmas 1940".

Our first show is scheduled for Saturday, October 12 at the Dutchman (Best Western) Inn at Huntingburg. If you need to make plans for overnight as we will, the enclosed brochure will give you the phone number. Dutchman Inn gives ten percent discounts to senior citizens, travel club cards, ect. They honor the Quest card. Breakfast is planned at 9:00 sharp with a very special guest to Uhl collectors; Mr. J.W. Disinger, a grandson of Louis Uhl. Mr. Disinger is president of Kruger Jewelers in Huntingburg. He will be speaking during our breakfast time together. When I phoned him last week, he was excited to hear that the society had been formed.

As you are aware, we have no treasury to work from so I have been very thrifty in planning this first meeting. We are to have a double room with tables set up for our displays. It very likely will be close quarters so if you have "stackables" to put on the table to increase your area, it would be advisable.

After breakfast, from 10:00-Noon will be set-up and society time. The public will be invited from Noon to 4:00. We should plan to be out of the room by 5:00.

What should you bring???? Anything you wish. Bring things you need help with to know if they are Uhl--bring pieces you wish to sell--and bring interesting things for display only to use in the education of others. One member I talked with recently is planning to have momentoes printed for gifts to us!

I will be sending articles to the Antique Trader and to the Huntingburg Herald to advertise. Hopefully, we'll be able to acquire some new members on the 12th. And raise enough money through a \$1. per person admission charge on non-members to be able to plan for a larger place next year.

Looking forward to seeing you all on Oct. 12. Get your reservations back to me real soon so I can go on with plans.
