1849 Uhl Pottery Co. First Pottery in United States Located Here

Evansville has the honor of having the first potter plant constructed in the United States. Louis and August Uhl, who had been operating a potter in Lisberg, Germany, came to the Untied States in 1849. They came down the Ohio River and after stopping at Cincinnati for a while, continued on to Evansville. Here they decided to locate permanently and erected their plant at Ninth and Main street.

When the supply of good clay was exhausted in this immediate vicinity, the firm started to prospect for the desired product in the surrounding territory and found it in Huntingburg. With the advent of the Southern Railway the old plant was abandoned and a new one erected at what is now Illinois and Crown Avenue. In 1908, this plant was sold and the firm moved to Huntingburg. A salesroom and warehouse are still located in Evansville on US Highway 41.

The production of the company has been continually increased until, at the present time, the production is one carload daily.

ANOTHER INDUSTRY FOR THIS CITY The Uhl Pottery Works, Capitalized at \$20,000 to locate in Huntingburg

While there hasn't been much blow and bluster made about it, nevertheless it's true that Huntingburg has succeeded in landing another manufacturing establishment.

After several weeks' consideration, The Uhl Pottery Company of Evansville, has decided to move their plant to Huntingburg. The company, in which Charles, Edgar, and Louis Uhl are the leading members, is capitalized at \$20,000. The company manufactures pottery ware of all kinds—jugs, jars, flower pots, etc.— and employs from thirty to forty men. These gentlemen are well acquainted with the superior qualities of the clay in this locality, having used it for many years and were anxious to get right in the midst of it, thereby saving the cost of shipping the raw material to their plant. The only consideration demanded at the hands of our people was the donation of a site on which to erect their plant. The citizens soon made up an amount sufficient to purchase two and one-half acres near the Huntingburg Press Brick Works, and the work of erecting the buildings will begin at once.

The main building, which will be of brick, will be two stories in height and 60 feet wide by 161 feet long. There will be other buildings of frame. The machinery, which will require from fifteen to eighteen cars for its removal to this city, will be shipped as soon as temporary sheds can be constructed from housing the same until the main buildings have been completed.

This industry will mean much for our people. It will be but a starter in the matter of working up our clay into manufactured articles for the market and the prospects are that a sewer pipe factory and other clay working plants will soon follow.

UHL IS THE REITZ STUFF

I was trying to show an example of the different stamps and examples of Uhl.

Membership forms were available as well as samples of McCurdy's book and the new Anna Mary Feldmeyer/Kara Holtzman Uhl Pottery guide. It was really interesting when people brought some Uhl with them. Some people remembered the store on Fares Avenue that sold Uhl products. I hope that members will go out to events and tell people about Uhl. It's really a lot of fun and you meet some great people. Currently there are 21 pieces of Uhl on display at the Reitz home.
