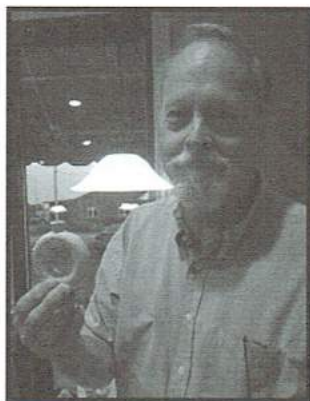

While I was looking through the past newsletters I came across the first set of rules that the Uhl Collectors Society was founded on, while some have changed due to privacy acts, or increased costs to the club. I think its something we should all re-visit or learn where we came from!

From the 10/19/1985 Newsletter:
The society was organized with the following rules:

1. Membership only to collectors of Uhl Pottery; not to those simply wanting "free schooling" for Financial gain.
2. Membership to run by calender year.
3. Permission to give your name, address, and telephone number to all members so they may contact you when in your area.
4. An annual trade show and sale to be held.
5. Input from members for the newsletters pertaining to the Uhl hobby.

6. Printing and distributing of a bi-monthly newsletter. (added since first annual meeting held on 10/12/1985)

7. A 3x5 card file to be kept by the president of members wants and items for sale.

8. Dues set at \$10.00 per year per household whether you are one collector or a plurality payable in January or before.
