The Jewel of Uhl !

The top selling item at the 2021 Uhl Gathering Auction was a hand turned 30 gallon handled jug with a unique marking that was hand painted under glaze. It sold for \$1550 at the gathering. It is really a great piece and the nickname "The Jewel of Uhl" is a good one.

The buyers, Kirk and Heidi Reller have a good history with the jug here is the story.

Kirk's mother was a good friend of Stendal antique dealer Kermit Winget. Kermit visited his home and often played Scrabble and Euchre and Cinch. He was known to have bought the jug in 1989 from a woman in Huntingburg. There is some discrepancy whether the jug was stored by the woman in the basement or porch. Either way he was proud of it. The jug never made it to his shop. It was in his private collection. Here is a picture of Kermit Winget and Juanita Reller with the jug from about 1989.

Kirk was told the jug was used in Uhl displays at the Indiana State Fair and probably other events. There is no proof of this, but it was common for pottery companies to produce jumbo size pieces for displays.

Kermit Winget died about 1991 and his estate was sold by Curran Miller auctioneers in Evansville over 4 days between July 30 and August 2, 1992. The four-page sale bill was mailed to society member and a picture of the "jewel" was prominent on page 1. No record of the sales price has been found. Kirk was unable to buy the jug at that time but was anxious to get it at the society auction.

Congratulations to Kirk and Heidi on this great purchase and thank you for sharing the story.

Personal Note:

Just to show once again it's a small world I will share a small connection. The Winget home was next door to my family's farm near Stendal. My siblings and I still own the property. I can recall my mother wondering what great antiques he had inside. Now, I know one of them.
